THE NEXT EU RESEARCH & INNOVATION
PROGRAMME (2021 – 2027)

European Framework Programmes

- Funding programmes created by the European Union/European Commission to support and foster research and innovation
- Began in 1984 and each last for 7 years and align to the EU's Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF)

Horizon 2020 ran from 2014 until 2020

- The previous Framework Programme (FP). Had its last call for proposals in 2020. Total budget for Horizon 2020 was ~ €80 billion.

Horizon Europe will run 2021 to 2027

- The 9th FP and successor to Horizon 2020 with a **€95.5 billion budget**
- Work Programmes due to be published in June 2021 although a few calls have already been launched.



The UK has agreed to Associate to Horizon Europe

UK 'Association' means continued UK participation



The UK has agreed to Associate to Horizon Europe

- UK entities will have **equivalent participation rights** to those from Member States
- UK entities **can lead projects as coordinators**
- **Participation and influence** on programme **governance** structures (e.g. programme committees)
- **UK experts** can continue to take part in peer review (register as an expert [here](#))
- **UK has continued access to Horizon Europe research and innovation funding**, infrastructure and markets
 - Able to access funding from all parts of the Programme including the ERC (European Research Council), MSCA (Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions), Partnerships, the EIT (European Institute of Innovation and Technology) and direct actions of the JRC (Joint Research Centre). The UK will be an associate to the COST programme. Can access the majority of the EIC (European Innovation Council) **except the EIC Accelerator equity fund**
 - Work programme level exclusions: only in exceptional and justifiable cases




- **€95.8 million** funding awarded
- **€11.5 million (11%) to the UK**
- **337 UK participations**


THE FUTURE: Horizon Europe Cluster 2: Culture, Creativity and Inclusive Society

- **€2.3 billion** funding available

Key Opportunities

- Not just for work with the EU
 - Associated countries
 - **Low and middle income countries**
- Cultural & Creative Industries

Horizon Europe structure



- €5.5bn total funding agreed for 2021-2027
- Budget figures **exclude** UK and other Associate Country contributions so will be higher
- Others likely to associate include Switzerland, Norway & Israel
- Canada, Japan, Australia etc. Interested status (TBC)

Project Types

Research and innovation actions (RIA)

- Activities aiming primarily to **establish new knowledge or to explore the feasibility** of a new or improved technology, product, process, service or solution.
- May include basic and applied research, technology development and integration, testing, demonstration and validation on a small-scale prototype in a laboratory or simulated environment.

Innovation actions (IA)

- Activities directly aimed at **producing plans and arrangements or designs** for new, altered or improved products, processes or services
- Possibly including prototyping, testing, demonstrating, piloting, large-scale product validation and market replication.

Coordination and support actions (CSA)

- Activities contributing to the objectives of the Horizon Europe Programme, excluding R&I activities (with some exceptions – see the General Annexes to the Work Programme)

Main Types of Project

- **RIA – Research and Innovation Actions** – up to **100%** funding rate. Page limit usually **45 pages**
- **IA – Innovation Actions** – up to **70%** funding rate (except non-profit, 100% applies). Page limit usually **45 pages**
- **CSA – Coordination and Support Actions** – up to **100%** funding rate. Page limit usually **30 pages**

Who is eligible and how to apply

Eligibility

- **Funding:** any type of legal entity established in EU Member State (MS) or Associated Country (AC)
Also legal entities from Low and Middle Income Countries (LMICs) if country listed in the Horizon Europe Programme Guide

Minimum consortium size

- **Collaborative projects (incl. RIAs, IAs):** Usually a consortium must have a minimum of 3 independent legal entities, each established in different EU Member States (MS) or Associated Countries (AC), **with at least 1 of them established in a MS**
- **Coordination & Support Actions:** One or more legal entities, which may be established in a MS, AC, or in exceptional cases and if provided for in the specific call conditions, in another third country.

Award Criteria

- Excellence
- Impact
- Quality and Efficiency of implementation

 - NCP's represent all cluster areas
 - **Worldwide NCP network** – EU Member States, Associate Countries and many 'third' countries
- **UK Knowledge Transfer Network (KTN):**
 - Thematic networks that offer a wide range of knowledge and expertise including on Horizon Europe
 - Identifies opportunities and helps identify partners
 - Invaluable support to NCP's
- **Innovate UK EDGE:**
 - Networks around the UK providing local help
 - First point of contact for small businesses on the European Innovation Council (EIC)
 - Complete suite of other business support
 - Has access to a large database of UK/other companies seeking collaboration
- **UK Research Office (UKRO):**
 - UK NCP's for the European Research Council and Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions
 - Regularly updated factsheets on UK participation on EU funded programmes – accessible by all
