
Context: HE in Palestine

Context: HE in Palestine



Islamic University of Gaza after Israeli bombing in 2014

- Since its inception, HE in Palestine has been repeatedly + systematically targeted by Israel
- 'Scholasticide' (Prof. Karma Nabulsi) systematic obliteration of Palestinian centres of education by Israel - arrest, detention or killing of teachers, students and staff, and the destruction of educational infrastructure
- Well-documented (e.g. Wind, 2023)





Context: HE in Gaza



Islamic University of Gaza after Israeli bombing in 2014

- Since Oct 2023, all 12 HEIs in Gaza destroyed or severely damaged plus libraries, archives, etc
- Widespread killing, mental/physical harm + displacement of students, academics + staff
- HE initially ground to a halt huge barriers to education + knowledge production
- 90,000 university students out of education, and no way to pay staff
- No coordinated response initially ... but in May 2024 there was an unprecedented call for support from leaders from Gaza's 3 main universities ...

Unified Emergency Statement by Palestinian Academics and Administrators of Gaza Universities

"We have come together as Palestinian academics and staff of Gaza universities to affirm our existence, the existence of our colleagues and our students, and the insistence on our future, in the face of all current attempts to erase us ...

We call upon our friends and colleagues around the world to resist the ongoing campaign of scholasticide in occupied Palestine, to work alongside us in rebuilding our demolished universities, and to refuse all plans seeking to bypass, erase, or weaken the integrity of our academic institutions. The future of our young people in Gaza depends upon us, and our ability to remain on our land in order to continue to serve the coming generations of our people ...

We built these universities from tents. And from tents, with the support of our friends, we will rebuild them once again."




More than 80% of schools and universities have been destroyed or damaged, <u>according to the UN</u>.

- Books and other online resources
- Virtual lab companies- LearnSci, Labster
- Mentoring PhD students
- Provided mental health support-joined up with UK professionals.



Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions

Palestinian Civil Society first called for BDS against Israel in 2005:

"We, representatives of Palestinian civil society, call upon international civil society organizations and People of Conscience all over the world to impose broad boycotts and implement divestment initiatives against Israel similar to those applied to South Africa in the apartheid era."

This would be until Israel complied with the following conditions:

- Ending its occupation and colonization of all Arab lands and dismantling the Wall
- 2. Recognizing the fundamental rights of the Arab-Palestinian citizens of Israel to full equality
- Respecting, protecting and promoting the rights of Palestinian refugees to return to their homes and properties as stipulated in UN Resolution 194






PACBI focuses on boycott of Israeli academic and cultural institutions because:

"Academic institutions are a key part of the ideological and institutional scaffolding of Israel's <u>regime of occupation</u>, <u>colonialism and apartheid</u> against the Palestinian people. Since its founding, the Israeli academy has cast its lot with the hegemonic political-military establishment in Israel, and notwithstanding the efforts of a handful of principled academics, the Israeli academy is <u>profoundly implicated</u> in supporting and perpetuating Israel's systematic denial of Palestinian rights." (excerpt from <u>PACBI Guidelines</u>)

There is mounting evidence of the complicity of Israeli universities in the occupation, apartheid system and genocide of the Palestinian people





Why Boycott Israeli Universities? (BRICUP Guidelines)

Academic Boycott

<u>PACBI Guidelines</u> state an academic boycott involves boycotting the following if supported/funded by the Israeli government, HEIs, corporations or associated support / lobby groups:

- **1. Academic events** (such as conferences, symposia, workshops, book and museum exhibits)
- Research and development activities (e.g. the EU-Israel Horizon 2020 scheme)
- 3. Funding for academic activities
- 4. Talks/debates at international venues with Israeli state officials or reps from HEIs
- 5. Study Abroad schemes in Israel for international students
- Special academic honours or recognition granted to Israeli officials, HEIs or reps of HEIs
- 7. Normalisation projects based on the false premise of parity between the oppressor and the oppressed
- 8. Institutional membership of Israeli associations in world bodies
- 9. Contribution to **academic journals based at Israeli universities**
- 10. Writing recommendations, advising on hiring at Israeli HEIs, etc.
- 11. Studying, teaching or conducting research at an Israeli HEI
- **12. Academic visits or fact-finding** missions that receive funding from Israel, its complicit institutions or lobby groups

N.B. there are exclusions – "Mere affiliation of Israeli scholars to an Israeli academic institution is ... not grounds for applying the

The situation in the world, and in Gaza in particular, requires us to act with a moral compass. There is great human suffering. As an academy, we have a duty to provide space for dialogue and for research that contributes to understanding and to solutions that do justice to peace and justice. This requires openness, even when it is difficult. It requires us to continue to meet each other in dialogue, with respect for differences. But it is also clear when there is genocidal violence and a line has been crossed. The call by demonstrating students and staff has been heard by me and my colleagues. We have effectively stopped or suspended all institutional collaborations with Israeli parties and will not start any new collaborations; a boycott is in place until further notice.

KCL WORKERS' PLEDGE

We, workers at King's College London (KCL), pledge to stand in solidarity with Palestinians and act for an end to Israeli occupation, apartheid, ethnic cleansing and genocide in Palestine by:


- (1) Refusing to participate in any formal or informal engagement with any Israeli higher education institution involved in supporting Israeli occupation, apartheid, ethnic cleansing, or genocide in Palestine.
- (2) Refusing to participate in any formal or informal engagement with any corporation involved in supporting Israeli occupation, apartheid, ethnic cleansing, or genocide in Palestine.
- (3) Working to provide direct support for Palestinian higher education institutions, academics, educators, and students.
- (4) Speaking out against all attempts to silence Palestine solidarity action and speech on our campus and beyond.

- Complicity reports by staff/students at various UK universities – e.g. LSE's <u>Assets</u> in <u>Apartheid</u>
- Examples of universities that have agreed to divest as a result of mounting pressure
 - Swansea (£5m divested from Barclays)
 - QUB (£800,000 from complicit companies)
 - Portsmouth (£800,000 from Caterpillar)
 - Trinity College Cambridge (divested multi-million pound portfolio from weapons manufacturers)





Resisting Erasure: Making Palestine Visible




Detail from poster for Solidarity Against Scholasticide tour of UK universities in Autumn 2024 To counter a systematic campaign of attempted erasure:

- Cultural events and displays (e.g. literature, music, dance, art, film, 'Palestine Corner' in library)
- Solidarity statements
- Rallies / marches / protests



- Wear your solidarity
- Talks / discussions in different disciplines (e.g. Palestine Dialogues at Sussex)
- Bringing Palestine into your teaching
- Fundraising events share via internal comms
- Marking significant dates e.g. Nakba Day (15th May), UN's International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People (29th November)






